The Governors have been working extremely hard this academic year. This term has seen the school involved in recruitment for a number of positions across the school. "The teachers work really hard - I really appreciate it!"

It was also interesting to hear your views on what the school could do better. There were two areas which some of you talked about in particular: Home School Diary/ Homework books and improving our sporting talents. Here is a selection of some of these comments:

"Communication with parents- home link book rarely comes home"

"Want homework targeted to topics, especially in Y5 and Y6"

"We are not competitive enough or good enough at sports- we don't dedicate enough time for teams"

"Cricket and Football clubs were on same day so children had to pick one. We can't field 2 good teams"

Thank you to all of you who took the time to speak to Mrs Baskerville. All comments have been passed on to Mrs Castle and the Senior Leadership team to see how we can improve on these areas and will be discussed at our next Standards and Outcomes meeting. We know some parents were concerned about the recent strike action taken by members of staff last week and lack of information as to the reasons for it. It is every person's democratic right to be allowed to take such action, and as such it is respected. The dispute concerns such issues as the cuts to funding given to each school, academisation and teachers terms and working conditions. These are national issues and not something the school, nor Mrs Castle, can influence. A neutral stance had to be taken by Mrs Castle. She was not allowed to use supply, nor use LSA to cover for the absent staff.

As we break up for the summer holidays we the governors want to say a massive thank you to Mrs Castle and all the staff who work so hard for our children throughout the year and a particular BIG thank you to the staff we are sad to see leaving this year - Mr West, Mrs Arnold, Mrs Parker and Mrs Firth. We wish them well for the future.

A massive thank you to our wonderful children who have again demonstrated this year how wonderful and special they really are and a huge thank you to you as parents for supporting the school - we know it takes a lot of effort from you and we appreciate it. Also we would like to wish the current year 6 a sad goodbye as they move on to secondary school.

And finally a massive thank you to those of you who support the school through volunteering, especially our FOWPS committee. They have done a fantastic job in providing wonderful opportunities and equipment for the children which make a significant difference to the pupils at this school.
